Laxshmi Rose Greaves is a research associate in the School of History, Archaeology and Religion at Cardiff University. She is a historian of South Asian art and religion. Her current Leverhulme-funded project charts the emergence, evolution and dissemination of Rāmāyaņa temple imagery across the Indian subcontinent between the fifth and tenth centuries CE.

Adam Hardy is Emeritus Professor of Asian Architecture at Cardiff University. His publications include The Temple Architecture of India (2007), and Theory and Practice of Temple Architecture in Medieval India (2015).
